# The Ascension (Ascension Day 10<sup>th</sup> May)

Acts 1:1-11 records Jesus final words to his disciples followed by his ascension to heaven.

Following is an excerpt from a commentary on the ascension by Jeffrey D. Peterson-Davis in "Feasting on the Word".

"The ascension narrative is also a story about waiting, about being in interim time, about life after someone significant is gone, about experiences of uncertainty.

Jesus promised that the Holy Spirit would come, but not now. After saying these things, he was lifted up and taken into the clouds. And the Spirit was not yet with them. While their mouths were still agape, the "men in white robes" proclaimed that Jesus would come again in the same way that he had just left.

It is not difficult to imagine the disciples' feelings after all of this. After all they had experienced, Jesus was now gone. They were left wondering and waiting, trusting that the Spirit would come but not certain when, speculating when Jesus might drop down from the clouds. The followers of Jesus found themselves in that uncomfortable space we know as "between".

We can easily connect our own experiences of being in the midst of uncertainty or expectation. While we crave resolution and desperately want to turn the page to the next chapter, in this story we are invited to dwell with the disciples in the between space. Our congregations know well these kinds of time: loss of a loved one, unemployment, broken relationships, waiting for a baby to be born, itching for a cast to be removed, awaiting the results of a biopsy, watching as a parent slips away to Alzheimer's.

Rather than rush to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, in this text we have the opportunity to enter the unresolved time and space created by the ascension.. " [end of excerpt]
