Matariki may be translated as tiny eyes, or eyes of God. The Pleiades appears in the sky in June as the Southern Hemisphere winter months approach. The eyes are thought to watch over the land and its people. The appearance of Matariki signals a time of change and new growth. It is a time to reflect on the past and look ahead to the future.

Matariki is a time for New Zealanders to celebrate our history and unique place in the world and to learn from those who came before us. It is a celebration of our culture, language and people. Matariki is an appropriate time to publicly pray for life and growth as well to offer prayers of thanksgiving.
